CRITERIA

An innovation should meet one or more of the following criteria:

1. *Quality* — Students and/or staff agree that the innovation increases quality in the course, program, office, or institution.
2. *Efficiency* — The innovation contributes to more efficient processes.
3. *Cost Effectiveness* — The innovation adds value to the institution while containing or reducing costs.
4. *Replication* — The innovation is easy to replicate at other institutions.
5. *Creativity* — The innovation is original and creative.
6. *Timeliness* — The innovation is not more than five years old at the institution, allowing plenty of time for it to be tested.

League Alliance colleges determine their own eligibility criteria and selection protocol and submit one winning Innovation of the Year. Nominations are encouraged from all areas of the college: full- and part-time faculty, administrators, and professional and support personnel; the range of participation is determined by each college.
