

Illusion of Inclusion: A Series on Race in America

In this five-day series, we will examine the globally perpetuated race-based system of exploitation and oppression, with a lens on America, resulting in the prevailing legacy of disparity in wealth, power, and privilege. The week begins with an exploration of what "race" is, underscoring how the idea of race—fueled by notions of White Supremacy—has been manipulated to facilitate colonial aspirations and the establishment of America. Encompassing the evolution of pop culture and current events, including police brutality, we conclude with a moment of reflection.
