An innovation should meet one or more of the following criteria:

- 1. Quality Students and/or staff agree that the innovation increases quality in the course, program, office, or institution.
- 2. Efficiency The innovation contributes to more efficient processes.
- 3. Cost Effectiveness The innovation adds value to the institution while containing or reducing costs.
- 4. *Replication* The innovation is easy to replicate at other institutions.
- 5. *Creativity* The innovation is original and creative.
- 6. *Timeliness* The innovation is not more than five years old at the institution, allowing plenty of time for it to be tested.

League Alliance colleges determine their own eligibility criteria and selection protocol and submit one winning Innovation of the Year. Nominations are encouraged from all areas of the college: full- and part-time faculty, administrators, and professional and support personnel; the range of participation is determined by each college.

The Innovation of the Year Award is designed to recognize League college staff members who have designed and implemented a significant innovation. Each year, the League recognizes Innovations of the Year.

Employees from all staff groups (faculty, administrators, and professional and support personnel) are eligible for nomination.

2015 RECIPIENTS VETERANS EARLY ALERT SYSTEM TAINE VINCI AND MICHAEL BATES



The Veterans Early Alert System was created and implemented to assist 800+ veteran/military students achieve academic success and maintain VA benefits. Faculty completed an online survey twice a semester; feedback received was used to inform students and connect them with individualized targeted support services, including counseling, accommodations for a disability, Blackboard online support, weekly group study skills and test-taking strategy workshops, and Go VETS: Veterans Educational Tutoring Services. The process is fully automated, uses existing software and campus resources, and can be easily replicated. Data shows an extremely high faculty response rate and a significant impact on student GPAs, retention, and completion. During this first year of the program, there was a 13.4% increase in overall GPAs and no veteran/military student did a complete withdrawal from the college in either semester.
