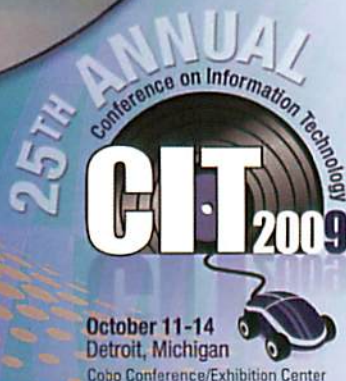

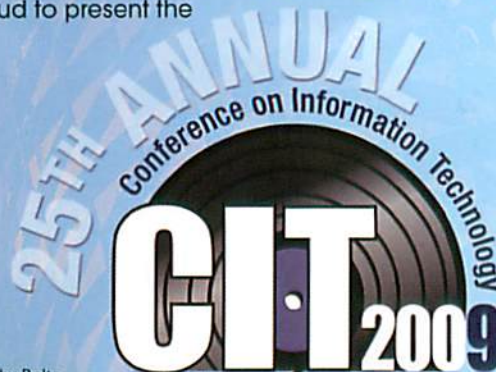

PROGRAM TRACKS

Track 1: Emerging and Future Educational Technology

Each year, Track One focuses on an emerging technology of particular interest to community college educators. For the 2009 CIT, the special focus of Track One is *Green Computing and Its Implications for Community Colleges*. How will the green computing movement affect community colleges? What educational programs and career pathways will emerge from green computing initiatives? What strategies are being used to acquire environmentally friendly computer hardware, realize cost savings, and achieve other green computing goals? How are colleges evaluating their green computing efforts to assure end-user satisfaction and organizational and societal success? Proposals targeted toward these or other questions related to green computing are strongly encouraged. Although green computing is the special focus of the 2009 CIT, other proposal topics are also strongly encouraged.

SESSION FORMATS

Forum Sessions

Forums are one-hour sessions featuring a successful practice, program, or fundamental issue related to information technology or a demonstration of a technological approach or solution.

Hands-On Alley Labs

Lab sessions are one-hour hands-on learning activities conducted in computer labs that allow participants to experience state-of-the-art hardware and software applications.

Learning Center Courses

Learning Center Courses are fee-based, three- or six-hour, lab- or nonlab-based sessions that deliver practical knowledge and applications. Selection of these courses is very competitive and is based on the thoroughness of the content and course design.

Poster Sessions

Poster Sessions take the form of an exhibit and are delivered primarily through the use of graphs, diagrams, pictures, data, and narrative text on bulletin boards. Presenters discuss their information with participants by making brief remarks and answering questions. **Neither electricity nor internet access is available in the poster session area.**

Roundtable Discussions

Roundtable sessions explore specific issues in an interactive setting of 10 to 12 participants. Roundtable facilitators are expected to lead substantive discussions or small group activities. **Neither electricity nor internet access is available in the roundtable discussion area.**
