
"It was 30 years ago today...."

On The 30TH Anniversary Of His Death, Please Join Us For A Special Sociology Film Series Event: A Screening of ⁶⁹⁹The John Lennon Assassination⁹⁹ and A CD Listening & Learning Event





Beloved Beatle and peace activist, John Lennon, was gunned down outside of his New York City home on December 30, 1980, a day some may never forget; by Mark David Chapman, a man some may never forgive. In commemoration, this very special Sociology Film Series will feature the 1996 documentary, *The Assassination of John Lennon*. "In this comprehensive chronicle, American Justice revisits the Lennon tragedy through interviews – including a rare tape interview with Chapman" - (*from DVD jacket*), convicted of Lennon's murder and serving life in prison in Attica State Prison.

Following the film, we will discuss the story-line lyrics and music of "Stay Human" (2001), a groundbreaking CD by Michael Franti & Spearhead that is set to the fictitious story of Sister Fatimah, a community activist on death row for a murder she did not commit. We will explore issues of capital punishment, incarceration, racism, sexism, homophobia, media literacy & more.
