Terrorism Issues, Threats and Tactics

The conference will give an overview of the history of terrorism. What is it, where does it come from, and why is it used? The conference will examine who becomes a terrorist and why, how terrorist are recruited, self-radicalization, domestic terrorist threats and terrorist financing and tactics.

The conference will cover a wide range of access points for those interested in gaining terroristic knowledge and how these ideas spread. Case studies and modern and historical examples will be used for key points. Special attention will be made regarding ISIS' Dabiq publication and Al Qaeda's Inspire magazine, as well as websites of both ideological and single issue terrorist organizations.
