# II. SPEAK TO THE SENATE

Miray Akbaba, the President of Global Union, thanked the Senate for the funding approval for International Day, which was held on April 28. The event was a complete success. It was a blending of cultures that brought different people and groups together. Events like this promote awareness of different cultures and their customs and foods. There were approximately 100 more people than expected, but the event ran smoothly and everyone enjoyed the food, talent show, and activities that represented different cultures. She gave a big thank you to the Muslim Club and the African United Club for their assistance in the planning and preparation.

Dr. Lloyd Holmes is in attendance today to discuss the new MCC Student Code of Conduct. He and Dr. Susan Baker from the Student Services Division have distributed copies of the proposed new code of conduct and Dr. Holmes would like to review it with the Senate. The goal was to make this document as clear and concise as possible. Dr. Holmes has approximately 20 years of experience with student conduct, and he felt it was extremely important that everyone understands the codes and how they work. MCC students, faculty, and staff should know exactly what the process is if a code is violated and we should have one system in place that deals with all issues. The current Code of Conduct has several methods and possible outcomes when a code is violated, and the new Code of Conduct has a singular system and process so all understand what should occur. The new Code of Conduct's judicial proceedings will be conducted by

a MCC Judicial Board. The board will consist of four (4) students, four (4) Faculty Association members, and two (2) CSEA members. The students will have a one (1) year term, and the faculty and staff will hold a two (2) year term. Dr. Holmes is pleased MCC would have a Judicial Board, and is confident this will allow for a streamlined process regarding conduct reviews, hearings, and sanctions. The revised Code of Conduct will be voted on in August.

Katya Mailloux-Kuz and Michael Klugo from the Travel Club attended the meeting to report back on their trip which was a cruise aboard the MSC Divina. This was the Travel Club's Spring 2015 trip and provided valuable insight into the cruise industry and the way things are ran and planned. The students got to see first-hand how passengers, food storage, "tendering" ship to shore excursions, and entertainment was planned. The received a "behind the scenes" tour of areas of the ship passengers would not get to see, and were able to witness ship operations on a daily basis. They toured several islands of the Caribbean and got to experience local culture. They thanked the Senate for this opportunity and it was extremely beneficial for those who are interested in the Travel and Tourism industry.
