Choosing a college or university to transfer to after completing your studies at Monroe Community College can, at times, feel overwhelming. It is a big decision. The choice you make is going to impact your success as a student and lay the foundation for your future. How do you start this process? What should you be doing as you research and choose schools? Often students select a school without putting much thought into it. Some may even select a school sight unseen. Sometimes it works out, sometimes it does not.

Let's think about the process one goes through when purchasing a car. Would you buy a car sight unseen or just take the car salesman's word that it's a good car and a perfect fit for you? Buying a car is a big investment. I suspect the majority of


