The Nazis were ordered to destroy every personal photograph brought by deportees to the concentration camps. At great risk, 2,400 pre-war photographs were hidden in a locked room in Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1943 where they escaped destruction. That's where Ann Weiss, a daughter of two survivors, found them 43 years later and began her journey to identify each and every one.
