The World Maps Gallery

A permanent gallery of 15 world maps showcasing aspects of human geography and physical geography will be installed this fall throughout the Brighton Campus and shown as a temporary poster display at the Damon City Campus. World maps will include the "upside down" map, the Peter's projection map, maps showing sports popularity, lightning strikes, water stress, a wealth cartogram, and several others. As in an art gallery or museum, the maps will have a display label explaining the map as well as a QR Code that students can scan with their smart phone, tablet or lap top to get additional information and ways to interact.
