FIELD TRIPS IN ITALY

Arrival in Rome: Before we begin your studies in Florence, we will spend three days visiting the Pantheon, Coliseum, Vatican City, Spanish Steps, Trevi Fountain and other tourist destinations in Rome the Eternal City

Day Trip to northern Italy in the Po Valley: Parma - Visit the Parmigiano Cheese Factory. Guided tour with detailed explanation of the process, marketing strategy and consortium policies. Also included is a visit to a "Prosciutto factory. In the afternoon visit a Traditional Balsamic Vinegar factory part of the Consorzio Produttori di Aceto Balsamico Tradizionale di Modena.

Day Trip to Pienza, Montepulciano - Pienza, a little town rich in Renaissance monuments, is known all over the world for its DOP Pecorino cheese. Montepulciano, located on the Via Francigena, is a typical village with an untouched medieval aspect. Its old towers, monuments and art treasures, together with the magnificent countryside, make of this small town a "must see" when visiting Italy. Montepulciano is also famous for a very prestigious wine (one of the Tuscany Superwines, the Vino Nobile di Montepulciamo, the first Italian wine to obtain the DOCG. During the trip students will taste typical foods and wines of the region in one of the Winery of Montepulciano
