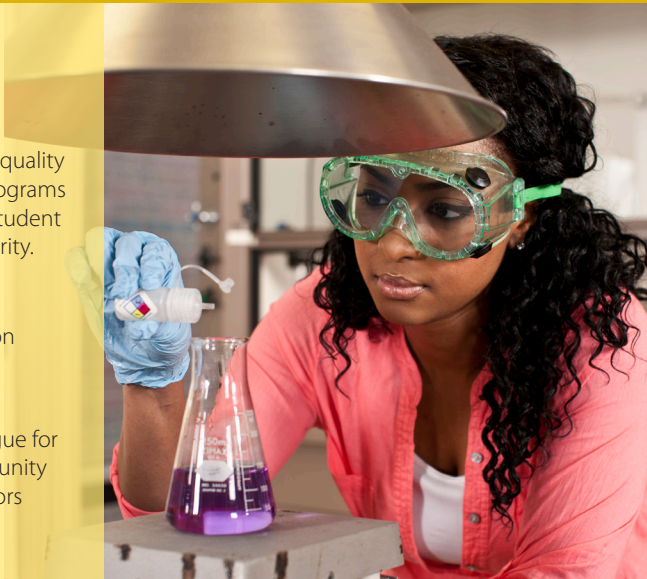

## COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2010-11, nearly 4,500 high school students from 31 school districts took courses through MCC for college credit in their home school through the Dual Credit program.

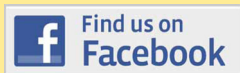
