McDonald's diaries record meetings with Hitler and Mussolini; Fresidents Hoover, Roosevelt and Tauman; Cardinal Mcelli, the uture Pope Pius XII; and Israeli leaders such as David Ben Gurion and Golda Meir, among many privers.
