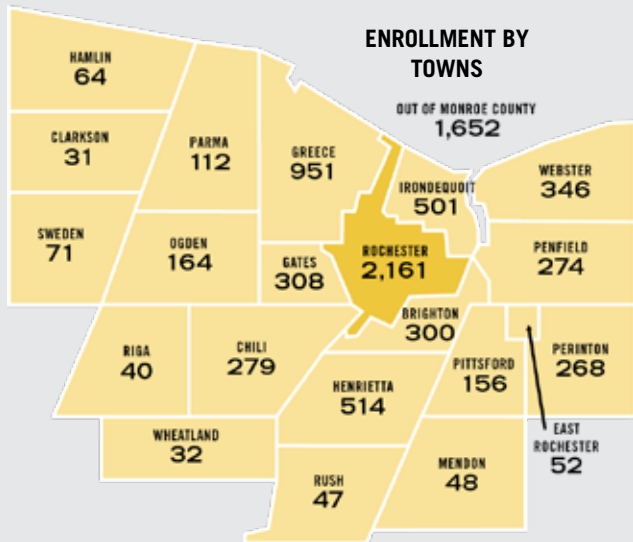

STUDENT AND FACULTY/STAFF HONORS

MCC scholars Amanda McGinnis, Alex Rowley, Ana Silvia Santos, and Jemeah Scott were among the 193 students who received the 2024 Chancellor's Awards for Student Excellence (CASE), SUNY's highest honor for academic excellence and leadership.

The entire 2024 dental hygiene class passed the Commission on Dental Competency Assessments examination with a score of **100%**. This examination is one of three required for New York State Licensure.

Monroe Community College Culinary Arts program student Tajineaque Scott won the American Culinary Federation Rochester chapter (ACFR) Student-Chef-of-the-Year while adjunct professor Chef Chris Januzzi, won Rochester area Chef-of-the-Year.

Professor Tokeya C. Graham (English and Philosophy) received the ROC the Future Alliance's Jacque Cady Annual Advocacy for Children Award, which recognizes an individual for extraordinary accomplishment in advancing public policy or funding decisions for the benefit of our community's children.

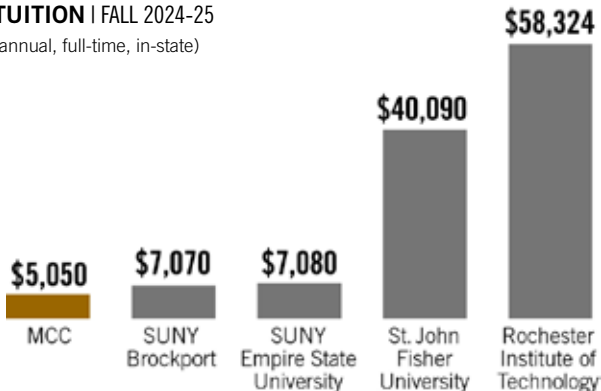

LEARNING PATHWAYS

MCC provides flexible learning opportunities to help diverse learners at all stages of their academic and professional careers meet their educational goals.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION: Programs meet industry standards and provide hands-on learning in high-demand fields.

COLLEGE TRANSFER: MCC has Transfer Paths with four-year institutions, including SUNY colleges, enabling graduates to transfer with junior standing.

MCC CORPORATE COLLEGE: Courses are delivered as open enrollment and custom training with credit and noncredit options.

The network runs from 2023 through 2028, in collaboration with the Aspen Institute College Excellence Program and the Community College Research Center.
