

# **ENG 101 – College Composition**

## **Course Description**

A course emphasizing college-level, source-based writing (summary, analysis, synthesis, research), with special attention to critical reading and thinking skills. Students will draft, revise, and edit multiple thesis-driven essays. They will also study and practice argument and persuasion. (ENG 101 or ENG 200 satisfy the composition requirement for graduation.) Three class hours.

## **Course Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Summarize sophisticated texts.
- 2. Analyze and critique persuasive texts.
- 3. Support a well-articulated thesis statement by integrating information from source material.
- 4. Locate and evaluate a variety of sources as potential support material in a written essay.
- 5. Use standard documentation style for source-based writing.
- 6. Exhibit proficiency in practices of standard written English (such as grammar, mechanics, and style).
- 7. Identify areas of weakness in their own written work, and revise for improvement.
- 8. Demonstrate basic oral communication skills.
