The Monroe County Public Safety Training Facility (PSTF), under the auspices of the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS), will be holding an *Aerosol Subject Restraint Instructor (ASR) Course* at 1190 Scottsville Road, Rochester, New York. This course prepares students to instruct topics related to the use of oleoresin capsicum (OC) aerosol restraint.

NOTE: Student exposure to OC is mandatory to qualify for instructor certification.

Students who successfully complete this course will receive DCJS certification as a ASR Instructor and one (1) college credit from Monroe Community College.

Prerequisites

- Completion of an Initial ASR program (MPTC or DoC); AND
- DCJS General Topics Instructor certification

 - Three (3) inert OC units of the type carried by the trainee

- History of chemical sprays;
- Selection, safety and effectiveness of chemical sprays;
- Hand held personal delivery systems;
- Methods of carry;
- Operational guidelines;
- In-custody death;
- Case studies;
- Decontamination;
- Deployment and Control Tactics/Empty hand techniques.

Graduation Requirements

- 90% attendance (policy set by Monroe Community College)
- Minimum 70% grade) on written examination
- Passing grade on practical exercises
