## Withdrawal Instructions

There are many reasons why you might need or want to withdraw. Before doing so, you should connect with your Student Success Coach. They can go over your options, especially since withdrawing can affect your financial aid, athletics eligibility, and veteran's benefits. You are responsible for 100% of tuition and fees if you withdraw from a course(s) after the add/drop period. Your withdrawal date is considered to be the date the official notification is received in the appropriate office.

You are not officially withdrawn until this process is completed and risk receiving "F" grades for all current courses if you do not initiate a withdrawal.

Withdrawal Policy: Complete withdrawals can be processed through the last day of the semester.

Grades earned for short term courses within the semester will remain on your transcript and will not be changed to "W" grades when completely withdrawing from the college. Courses ending on or after the complete withdrawal request will be issued "W" grades. You may not request a complete withdrawal from a course that ended earlier in the term but has not yet been graded.

After a complete withdrawal from a term, you will not be required to apply for readmission through the Admissions Office unless you stop out for more than two semesters or plan to return in a different program.
