

# Class of 2015 Profile

**2,670 students graduated from summer 2014 through spring 2015.**

- 1,739 (65%) were transfer program (A.S. & A.A.) graduates
- 661 (25%) were career program (A.A.S.) graduates
- 270 (10%) were certificate program graduates

## Highlights:

- 1,923 (72%) are employed and/or are continuing their education
- Of the Career and Certificate Program graduates who are employed full-time, 92% are employed in Monroe or an adjacent county.
- Graduates were hired by 621 different employers
- 50% of the graduates who are continuing their education are doing so at a SUNY/ CUNY institution
- Graduates transferred to 162 different colleges
