

- File a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each academic school year. Most colleges utilize FAFSA information to determine additional aid and scholarships you may be eligible for as a transfer student.
- Some private institutions also require completion of the College Scholarship Service (CSS) Profile to determine aid and scholarship eligibility. This is a fee-based service provided by College Board. Visit <u>College Board</u> for a list of colleges and universities that require the CSS Profile.
- Scholarship applications often require letters of recommendation, transcripts, essays, etc.
- Pay close attention to deadlines.
