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WHEREAS, community colleges serve as economic engines that provide a trained workforce and educated citizenry for the State of New York and the local communities in which they're located;

AND WHEREAS, community colleges are anchor institutions that help keep their communities strong and vibrant by serving as major employers, community hubs, and social centers;

AND WHEREAS, community colleges are the primary catalyst to the middle class by serving more low-income students than any other sector of higher education;

AND WHEREAS, community colleges anticipate and respond to the emerging needs of their local communities and remain the most adaptable sector of higher education;

AND WHEREAS, community colleges serve nearly half of all undergraduates enrolled in the SUNY System along with nearly as many life-long learners through non-credit classes;

AND WHEREAS, a level of predictability in State funding is essential to provide community colleges the ability to plan and budget accordingly and recognizes each college's annual fixed costs;

AND WHEREAS, the 98% of the previous year or \$100 increase per FTE, whichever is greater, language added to the community college funding model for fiscal year 2019 was a step in the right direction and appreciated;

AND WHEREAS, the funding floor should be set in State statute at 100% of the previous year or \$100 increase per FTE, whichever is greater;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Monroe Community College fully supports the proposal that New York State change the base state aid formula allocation for each community college to be permanently set annually at 100% of the previous year or \$100 increase per FTE, whichever is greater.

### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Monroe Community College approve the MCC Foundation's recommendation that the Learning Commons at the Downtown Campus be known as the Anne M. Kress Learning Commons as of December 9, 2019.

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WHEREAS, Dr. Anne M. Kress's inspiring and visionary leadership for the past decade as Monroe Community College's sixth president has strengthened the College's reputation as a leader among U.S. community colleges and propelled MCC to become a national model for best practices in workforce development; and

WHEREAS, during her tenure as president from 2009 to 2019, Dr. Anne M. Kress has elevated the College's visibility and voice on state and national levels, paving the way for MCC to have a seat at the table for important conversations that are shaping the future of higher education; and

WHEREAS, as the college's first woman president, Dr. Anne M. Kress has served as a role model who embraces diversity and inclusion and has created opportunities for both students and employees to become leaders themselves; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Anne M. Kress's commitment to college access and student success is reflected in the transformational initiatives achieved at MCC under her presidency and that will become her legacy, including the establishment of the Downtown Campus and the Economic & Workforce Development Center, the Schools @ MCC, partnerships with early college high schools, impactful holistic support and services for students, and programs that inspire global learning and international engagement among educators and students; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Anne M. Kress hosted a series of nine *Essential Discussions: Conversations at Monroe Community College* that attracted national voices to the College to benefit educators and students at MCC and throughout the Finger Lakes Region—conversations designed to help colleges deliver on the promise of higher education and better support students as they pursue a college credential; and

WHEREAS, her ability to initiate and form partnerships with leaders and employers across Monroe County has ensured learning experiences and academic programs directly correlated with college transfer and workforce needs, strengthened our community's shared prosperity, and created opportunities for the thousands of MCC graduates who earned certificates and degrees during her presidency;

WHEREAS, Dr. Anne M. Kress has been a tireless advocate for MCC, the State University of New York and for public higher education, a valued partner in public-private initiatives, and an exemplary community leader whose efforts and service have benefited the College and its Foundation, leading to impactful workforce development programs and successful completion of the historic *Every Bright Future Needs A Strong Foundation* capital campaign that raised more than \$52 million to support scholarships and programs to benefit MCC students; and
