## Camp Registration:

Any application that is not completed, signed and accompanied with required documents will not be accepted and the child will not be able to attend. Healthy Hero Camp will not accept any application materials on the first day of camp.

If your child is accepted into camp, you will be notified via email (if provided) and additional camp information will be mailed to the home address listed on the application. If your contact information changes, it is your responsibility to provide updated information to the Healthy Hero Camp office.

**IMPORTANT:** Absolutely no disruptive behavior will be tolerated at the Healthy Hero Summer camp, on MCC grounds or the camp provided busses. This is an educational camp based on building healthy behaviors. All children are expected to participate fully each day. Children will be suspended or expelled from camp if they demonstrate disruptive behavior or if they do not participate in camp

## The Program:

Campers will participate in a wide variety of sports activities. All Campers will participate in age appropriate activities including:
